II. Activities Sheet

Please submit a list of all high school activities, community service, work experience and honors/awards and include dates of involvement. Résumé style is an option, but not required . Limit this sheet to one page maximum.

III. Creative Cover Page

This is the part of the application that you can express who you are, so get creative and design an 8.5" x 11" cover sheet for your application. Include elements of your favorite activities (Music? Sports? Art? Friends?) and parts of your personality (Spunky? Determined? Outgoing?) and let them loose on your cover page! Please make sure that your Student I.D. Number is written on the back.

IV. Essays

Limit each answer to **200** words (short and sweet is perfectly fine!). Please make sure to write your Student I.D. Number on any additional pages you might include in your application.

Section A: Please answer the following essay question.

1. What do you expect to gain from FCC, and how do you think you can contribute to the FCC as one of its members this year?

Section B: Please answer 2 of the following 4 essay questions.

1. FCC is comprised of some of the most spirited students on UA's campus. We pride ourselves on our community and learning about UA's traditions and history. Please write a short poem or story about why you chose to attend the U of A.

- 2. One of the objectives of the FCC is to work as a group to reach out to the freshman class on behalf of ASUA. Please describe how you have contributed to a team or an organization, and how that experience has impacted you?
- 3. FCC members work together throughout the year to volunteer both in the U of A and Tucson communities. Tell us a time that you've given back to your community, as well as give one idea of how a large group like FCC can give back to the community.
- 4. FCC is a wonderful freshman transition program where you can learn so much about the UofA while meeting some of your very best friends. Please explain what friendship means to you, and qualities you look for in a good friend.

V. Object that represents you*

Choose some sort of object to accompany your application, which **must** fit in a standard 10"x13" manila envelope (without manipulating the envelope) and include an explanation (150 words maximum) of why you chose that object and how it describes you. Do not use liquids, food, perishable items, etc. Items that do not fit in the envelope will not be accepted.
